

Researching The Grey Partridge and the reasons it is under threat

In the film "Fact File 9- The Grey Partridge" you learned how the loss of habitats threatens species such as the grey partridge.

There are 4 major factors, discussed in the film, which have led to a catastrophic loss in grey partridge numbers over the last 70 years.

- 1. Loss of dedicated conservation managers such as gamekeepers.
- 2. Changes in farming methods so that crops are now planting in the autumn rather than the spring, and there is no fallow or stubble left over the winter.
- 3. A requirement to produce more food and therefore intensify farming methods.
- 4. The increased use of insecticides (chemicals to kill insects which damage food crops) and herbicides (weed killers to kills plants that are not wanted).

The numbers of grey partridges in Northern Europe have declined by 80% in the last 60 years. These birds are now on the 'Red List' for birds of conservation concern.
